#### The GCGP area

Mainly rural and mostly affluent. No large cities, many market towns.

Population 1.34m

63,000 businesses (mostly SMEs) contributing over €38.6bn to the UK economy

Cambridge – global centre of excellence, based on world famous University and multiple spinouts across innovation, technology and knowledge-based sectors including life sciences, agri-tech and advanced manufacturing

Peterborough – financial services and many cleantech businesses, but a lower economic base with significant areas of social deprivation

## **Project summary**

- Address intra-regional economic disparity between cities of high growth and innovation and less prosperous areas
- Capitalise on innovation assets of places with strong knowledge-based economies to develop capability needed to support supply chain to drive industrial growth
- Find a way to cascade business growth opportunity into these less prosperous areas to build future supply chains
- Create better links between skills supply and business growth





### Why a transnational approach?

- Collaborative approach allows comparative assessment and exchange of experience and best practice
- Sector to sector transfer between partners will identify new innovative approaches
- Model draws on different approaches but is tuned to local needs
- Innovation in the wider NSR will be firmly rooted in regional capacity and potential
- Improved networking between of innovation centres across the NSR





## **Support for NSR Programme objectives**

- Analyse gaps in regional innovation capacity
- Model how innovation can happen at local level
- Develop methods to address gaps
- Use the model to help SMEs innovate and grow
- Identify new innovation potential outside existing innovation hotspots
- Increase innovation capacity and business growth

- Horizon-Scanning/Knowledge-Transfer hubs created
- Authorities/practitioners equipped to increase scope and quality of innovation in enterprises
- Increased innovation capacity and business growth
- 60 new jobs and start-ups in the North Sea Region
- Amount and scope of innovation being carried out in enterprises will increase
- 200 SMEs engaged directly and 500 indirectly in delivering innovation products and services
