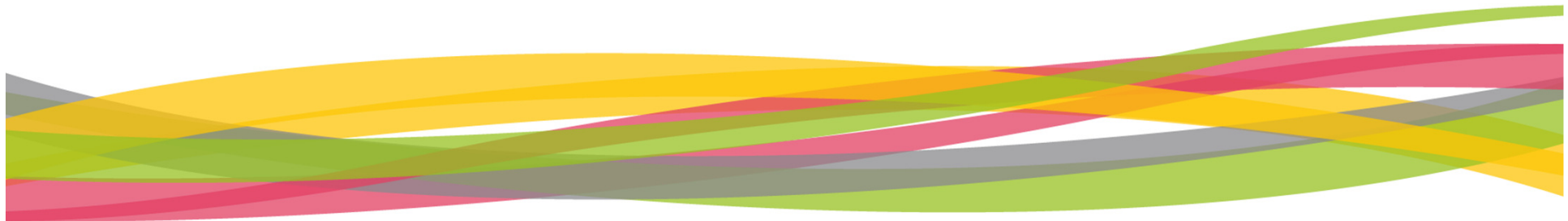

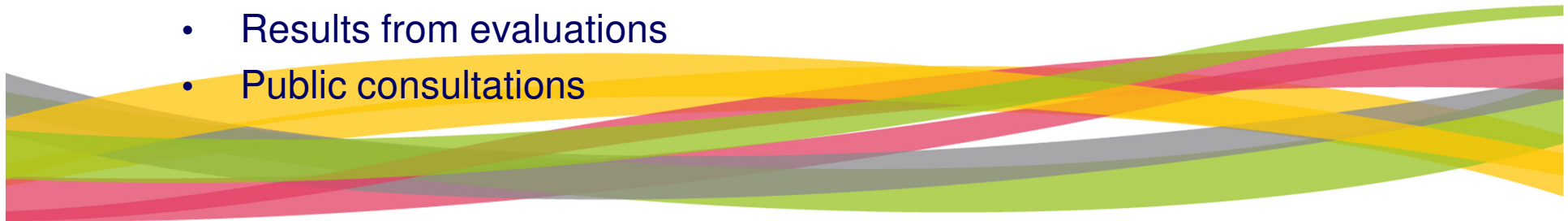
The structure of the programme

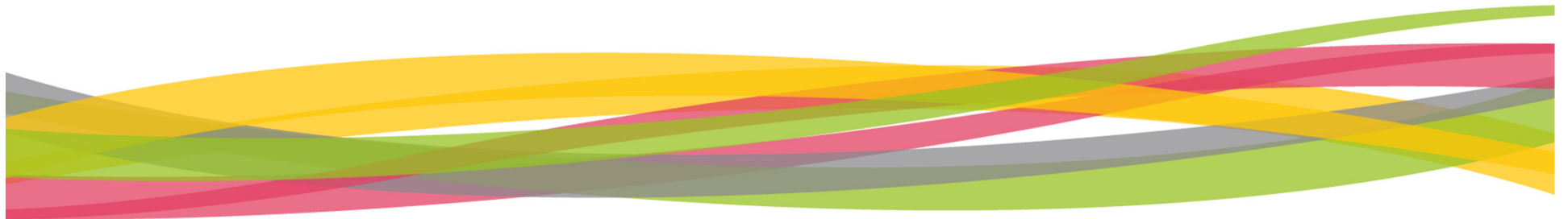
Key message:

- Public consultations

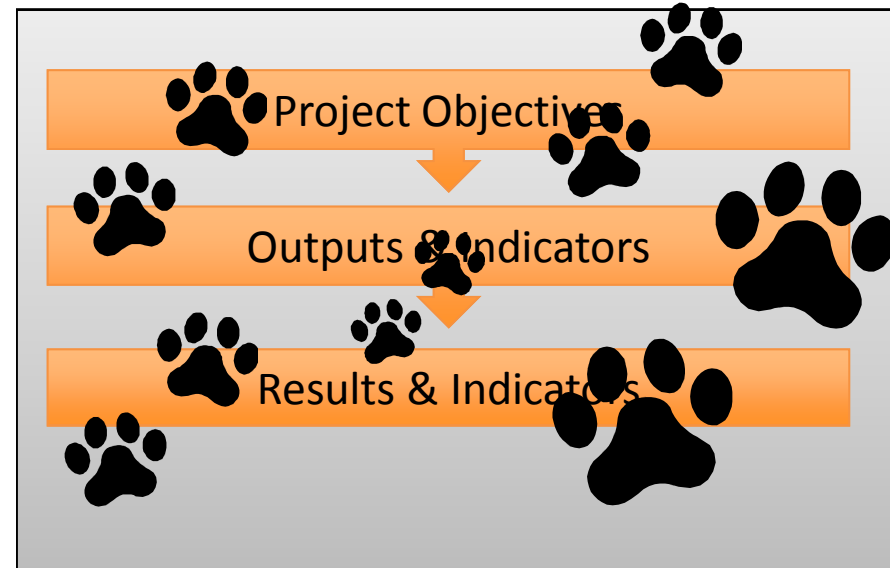




The new intervention logic

Project Level

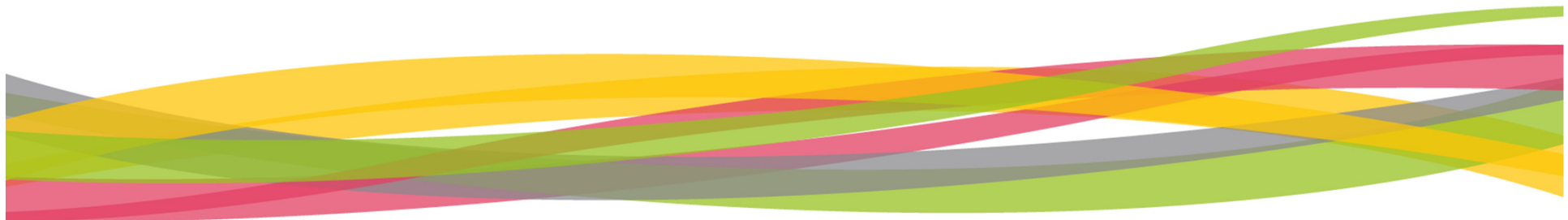


How to make the best contribution to sustainable, inclusive, knowledge-based growth in the North Sea Region with the available funds?



Project opportunities in 4 priorities:

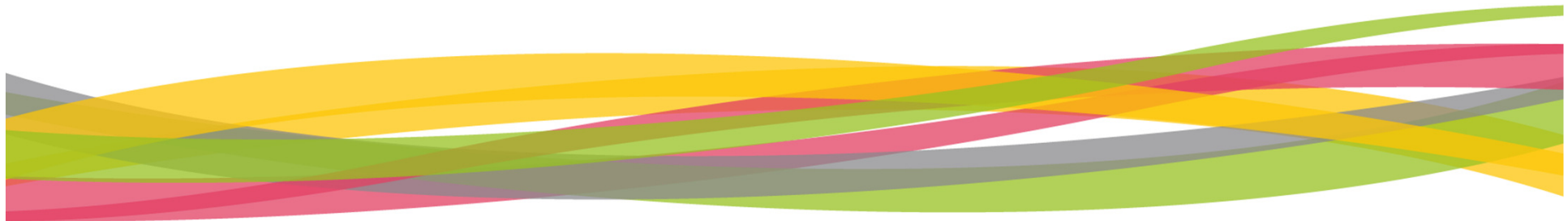
- Thinking Growth – supporting growth on the North Sea Region economies
- Eco-innovation – Stimulating the green economy
- Sustainable North Sea Region – Protecting against climate change and preserving the environment
- Green transport and mobility





The Strategic VB Project will

- + Deliver transnational solutions through joint implementation on shared challenges or joint assets in the NSR
- + Develop joint results and services at field level across the North Sea Region, which you can't do alone
- + Have an impact on policy development for NSR Area (EU, national, regional levels)

How to select and use indicators



Select deliverables from the list of options based on main activities



Use the output indicator for the specific objective you are working with



Use all five compulsory output indicators as required by the European Commission



Explain how your project outputs and results contribute to Programme results



Set realistic targets for all indicators and plan how to collect data



Select your own project results to measure the quality of your output



Report on progress at least once a year



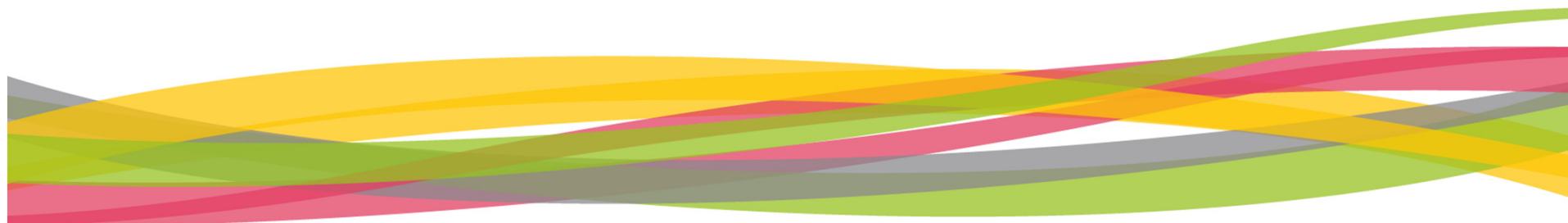
Progress on targets is important - if the Programme does not reach 85% of targets, the Commission may not pay all funds



Make sure you can provide evidence for the figures you report

Indicators for Deliverables (some examples!)

Type	Indicator
Deliverable	Exchange of information event (external) + Number of participants
Deliverable	Report/strategy + Numbers of readers
Deliverable	Pilots/demonstrations
Deliverable	Working practice change





Main Output Indicators – related to a Specific Objective -example

1.1	Number of enterprises cooperating with new / improved knowledge partnerships
-----	--

4 other compulsory indicators

Output	Number of enterprises participating in cross-border, transnational or interregional research projects
Output	Number of research institutions participating in cross-border, transnational or interregional research projects
Output	Number of organisations / enterprises adopting new solutions by project end
Output	Number of organisations / enterprises informed about new solutions by project end





Project Results – Measures the benefit/change which can be attributed to your project (2-3 per project)

Examples:

1. Reduction in flood risk at target sites by XXX%
2. Performance of infrastructure will be enhanced/increased/improved by XXXX
3. Increase in number of graduates completing a trial work period in an SME
4. Increase in number of users of solutions developed

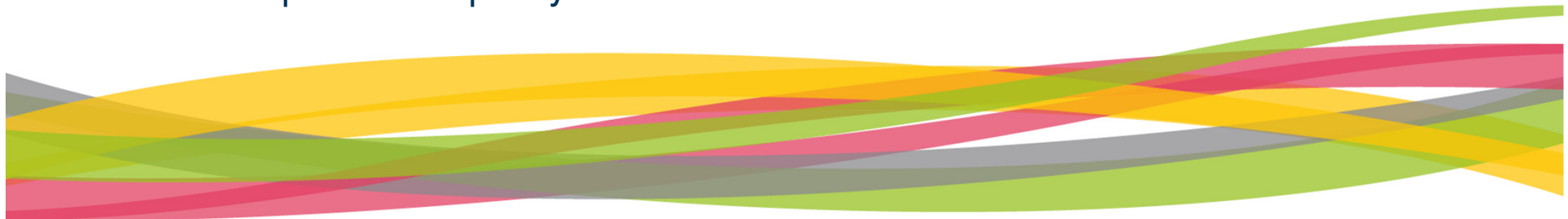




Example – Specific Objective 3.2

3.2 Develop new methods for the long-term sustainable management of North Sea ecosystems

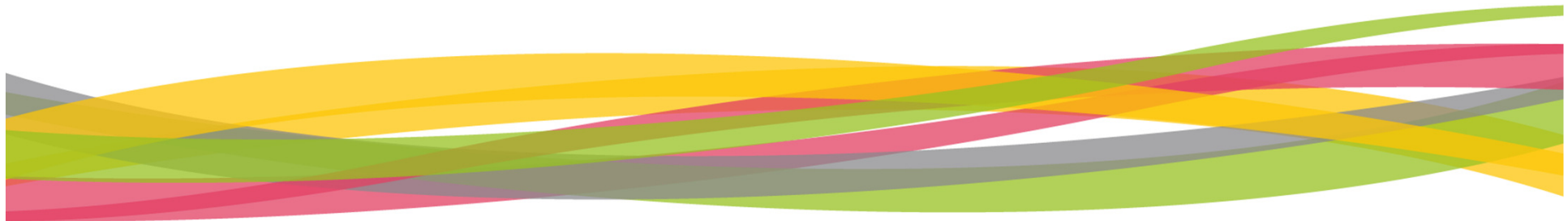
- **Project Output Indicator:** Number of sites managed using new solutions supporting long-term sustainability
- **Project specific result confirming usefulness of the output. More than one possible:** Increased return on public investment by adopting participatory/ co-governance approaches to management of NSR ecosystems (target 20%)
- **Required Programme result:** Capacity of North Sea Regions to improve the quality of the environment





Common features for all priorities

- + Pilots and testing
- + Limited number of programme goals
- + Implementing EU & national policies
- + Building on earlier results
- + Synergies with EU programmes
- + Innovation



Concluding summary

Key message: The NSR programme is offering Transnational solutions through joint implementation.

You can:

- + Expand your trans-national network, because you are sharing challenges or joint assets in the NSR
- + Participate in development of joint outputs and services, which your organisation can't do alone
- + Have a stronger impact, because the project is reaching an innovative Region of 60 mill. Inhabitants
- + Fit with EU & national policies
