Optimise output and fulfil the social need to meet in a group

- Generate ideas as a nominal group
 - – any ideas allowed, 'suspend judgement'. (Can do this in advance.)
- Build on these in the brainstorm
- Encourage paired discussions within the brainstorm idea
 - (where you **can** be devil's advocate).
- Groups no bigger than six (no social loafing)
- Have breaks (pastries optional)



Affirmative Enquiry

- LEGO Serious Play method addresses developing participants understanding of co-design differing interpretations that different stakeholders might bring to the table.
- Delegates use an Affirmative Inquiry approach
- Use 3D building challenges to help delegates think creatively and progressively work towards shared understanding of concepts and analogies.

Co-creation – Co-Design


- Working in small groups (n<6) or on your own.



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

Take Home Messages



- Participatory Methods to seed Co-Creation
 - Working in the Nominal Group (to maximise ideas)
 - Problem Definition is Hard, and takes time
 - Affirmative Enquiry
 - The best solutions are developed from a clear, shared understanding.
 - Hybrid Workshops may be possible (but proceed with care)
 - MIRO is more accessible and reusable than Post Its
 - But Post Its can be used as first step to MIRO
 - "Scribes" can be good for accessiblity
